## Domestic and family violence is a hidden crisis in rural and remote Australia.

## Already terrifying situations are compounded by:

- Community Dynamics: Small communities can have close-knit social structures where privacy is limited, and 'family problems' aren't spoken about.
- Isolation: Geographic isolation can be used as a form of control, with perpetrators cutting access to transport and communication with friends and family.
- Limited Access to Services: Victims of domestic violence may face hours of driving to access support services.
