Our History

Over 110 years ago, Reverend John Flynn OBE was commissioned by the Presbyterian Church to look at the needs of people in the Australian Outback. His report resulted in the establishment of the Australian Inland Mission in 1912, which is now known as Frontier Services.

Flynn had a vision to establish a "mantle of safety" so people could build sustainable communities despite the hardships of outback Australia. He was instrumental in establishing many of the services for remote Australia that people still rely on today.

So significant has been the impact of our founder, his story is depicted on our currency, featuring on the \$20 note: a picture of Rev John Flynn, an early Bush Chaplain, an early medical diagnostic chart, the pedal radio and the Royal Flying Doctor Service. Frontier Services' founder, Rev John

What are the needs of remote Australia today?

As access to mental health and other critical services in rural and remote areas continues to decline, the disparity between metropolitan and remote areas continues to grow. Now more than ever, the people of remote Australia need our help.

Statistics show the incidence of suicide and self harm for men in remote Australia is twice as high as that for men in metropolitan areas, yet the funding for mental health and other medical services to support someone living in remote Australia is up to 7 times less.*

Remoteness has never just been about geography. Economic change impacts disproportionately in remote areas, often devastating people's lives and hopes.

And the environment is always tough. The sense of social isolation is more prevalent now than it has ever been, providing the space between anguish and solace, in which our Bush Chaplains and Outback Links volunteers make the difference.

Today, our Bush Chaplains continue to provide practical, pastoral and spiritual care to isolated families and communities across Australia. They are often first responders in times of personal or community disasters. In addition to their traditional chaplaincy work of baptisms, weddings and funerals, they provide a listening ear to the issues affecting families and communities. As trusted companions, they bring fellowship and a sense of connection. They are and always have been standing with people in the bush.

For years, our Outback Links volunteer program has been connecting skilled volunteers with people in remote Australia who could use a helping hand. We provide relief through our community of more than 1,000 volunteers, who donate their time and skills to do repairs and maintenance on equipment, the home and around the property. Our volunteers bring hope and resources to those living in isolation.

Our Bush Chaplains and Outback Links volunteers go where they are needed. They make long journeys across inhospitable terrains to celebrate life's joys and hardships in creek beds, on verandas, on beaches, in pubs. They are steadfast friends, always available to lend a hand.

"My vision is for the work of Frontier Services to continue for many years to come."



Eula's eternal connection to Frontier Services

Frontier Services has been part of Eula's life for as long as she can remember. She is heartened to know that her deep connection with the bush and the people living on the land can continue into the future, thanks to a gift she has left in her Will.

"Leaving a bequest to Frontier Services feels like a way to pay it forward for the huge role it has played in my life and my family's. It's also a way to keep the connection after I'm gone," says Eula.

"Fred McKay influenced Dad's decision to become a minister, and we all lived in Western Australia while he trained and worked as a home missionary," shares Eula. "Dad's work and mum's involvement meant I really grew up with AIM and Frontier Services built into our family."

As a young adult, Eula qualified as an Early Childhood Educator in Sydney but felt the strong calling of the bush. She successfully applied to join AIM in their preschool at Halls Creek in WA to work with First Nations communities.

"I wasn't aware that, at the same time, Dad also had a calling to become a Patrol Padre, now called Bush Chaplain," she adds. "He ended up going back to Alice Springs as I was leaving for Halls Creek."

To Eula, the family's lifelong connection with the church and Frontier Services is an ever-present adventure for all of them. Proudly she adds, "Red dirt is in my blood." Eula emphasises that the true value of Frontier Services is often in the discreet activities.

"A listening ear, a good yarn, makes such a difference to people living in the bush, and it's really important we continue to provide that sense of connection."

When asked what she'd say to anyone considering leaving a Gift in their Will to Frontier Services, her answer was simple and immediate:

"You shouldn't underestimate the power of your generosity.

"I leave to the John Flynn Foundation, ABN 66 261 841 602, of 262 Pitt Street Sydney NSW 2000, [the residue of my estate] or [% percentage of my estate] or [the sum \$* specific amount] and I direct that the receipt of the Treasurer or other proper officer or such authorised officer shall be sufficient discharge to my executors."
